

Tips for Parking on Your Visit to the HangAh-Hillside Cultural Center:

Free Parking

If you are planning to stay or visit HangAh-Hillside Cultural Center for only a few hours or half the day, usually there is plenty free street zoning parking spaces about five to six blocks up the hill of Chinatown, i.e., the Nob Hill Area. They are up on Clay, Sacramento, or Washington Streets crossing Manson, Taylor, and Jones and beyond. These are hilly slopes - watch out.

Pay Parking:

The cost between Garages or Street-Meters parking is about the same on the weekend; therefore, I would encourage garage parking.

Sutter Stockton Garage (0.51 mi from HangAh-Hillside Cultural Center):

The garage that will not require any crossing of streets is Sutter Stockton Garage (330 Sutter Street, 94108, 415-982-7275) and it is a "flat-walk"; enter on Stockton Street. After parking your vehicle, please follow sign to Stockton Street exit, walk through the tunnel, you will see Sacramento Street facing you, turn right, HangAh-Hillside is only steps away to your right.

St. Mary's Square Garage (0.23 mi from HangAh-Hillside Cultural Center):

This garage is located at 433 Kearny Street, 94108, 415-956-8106. You may enter via Kearny street or California street, after parking your vehicle, please follow sign to California Street exit, walk toward Chinatown using Grant Street to your left, then the next cross street is Sacramento Street, turn left, HangAh-Hillside cultural center is on the left side of the block.

Portsmouth Square Garage (0.27 mi from HangAh-Hillside Cultural Center):

This garage is located at 733 Kearny Street, 94108, 415-982-5353. Mostly local residents or the Bay Area visitors use this garage when they visit Chinatown, perhaps due to a less expensive parking fee, I haven't yet had the time to compare pricing, will keep you posted when pricing comparison is done. Enter on Kearny Street, walk toward Clay Street/Chinatown Plaza exit after parking your vehicle. Up the hill toward Grant Street in Chinatown, turn left on Grant Street, walk one block to Sacramento Street, cross the street once you are at Sacramento, turn right on Sacramento after crossing, walk up the hill, HangAh-Hillside is on your left.

Meters:

Meters can be found all over the streets in Chinatown; in general, it costs \$2.50 for one hour meter parking on the weekend. Meter men come often to check for expired meters. Meters take quarters only.
